Mixed (Commingled) Recycling



Mixed or Commingled recycling are materials all mixed together, such as plastic bottles with paper, glass and metal containers. Mixed (Commingled) recyclable materials require sorting after collection before they can be recycled.

Please take note of the following for items you can and can't put in your bin:

✓ Acceptable	* NOT Acceptable
Aluminium cans	Food
Steel cans (includes empty cooking oil containers)	Gladwrap/clingwrap
Glass bottles & jars	Takeaway coffee cups
Paper - all kinds	Crockery/ceramic/drinking glasses
Cardboard - remove any food scraps from food boxes. Please flatten boxes before placing in bins.	Plastic bags (includes cleaners bags, shopping bags, biodegradable bags & freezer bags)
Plastic tubs, jars and bottles with codes 1 - 7 as long as they are empty (residues are OK)	<u>Soft/'Scrunchable'</u> plastic (e.g. confectionery wrappers/ chip packets/ice cream wrappers even if it has a plastic identification code on it)
Clean tin foil/alfoil - scrunch into a loose ball	Polystyrene or foams
	Waxed cardboard
	Coffee pods
	Paper hand towels
	Other General waste



What else do I need to know?

- The unacceptable items listed above not only interfere with the recycling sorting process but they can also harm the MRF workers.
- 2. Please ensure your recyclables are loose. NOT IN PLASTIC BAGS!
- **3.** Please **flatten cardboard boxes** before placing them into the Mixed Recycling bin.
